- Strengthens the capacity of governmental organisations, CSOs, private sector and academia, at local and national level in their participation, advocacy, and implementation of forest dialogues.
- Participates in identifying needs for external support and advice, works on policy recommendations and develops a strategic approach.
- Coordinates and implements multi-stakeholder workshops, negotiations events and other dialogues related to the project activities.
- Ensures networking and liaison with partners.

- Advises partner institutions on clarification, identifying needs, developing concepts and strategies, and provides technical and legal advice in the FLEGT-VPA and EUDR processes.
