Libya: Hope in dark times

Civil war has been raging in Libya since 2011. Despite the current ceasefire, Libyan society continues to suffer from the consequences of war. To spread hope, the German Federal Ministry for Economic Development and Cooperation (BMZ) commissioned a programme in 2017, co-financed by the EU, to support and strengthen 17 Libyan communities. This reaches potentially more than 1.4 million people. Among other measures, a women's centre was established right in the middle of Tripoli. It is the first of ten planned centres that will enable Libyan women to continue their professional development, by, for example, taking part in vocational courses and learning how to build their self-confidence at work.

Sri Lanka: Time for reconciliation

The 2019 Easter bombings showed just how fragile the peace in Sri Lanka is, even ten years after the end of the civil war. To foster dialogue and understanding between the different religious groups, GIZ runs a reconciliation project on behalf of the German Federal Foreign Office. The project is co-financed by the EU. Memorial events, art and cultural projects as well as moderated discussions contribute to coming to terms with the past and strengthening peace in Sri Lanka. A mobile museum takes its guests on a journey through various chapters of Sri Lanka's history since independence.
