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Support Programme for Decentralisation and Financial Governance in Cameroon

Actors in decentralisation fulfil their role in citizen-oriented governance more effectively with respect to the particular needs of women and girls, and of gender equality

Context

Cameroon has adopted a series of laws and strategic documents aimed at strengthening its development. These include 2035 Vision and the National Development Strategy 2020-2030 (SND30), which set out the priorities. These strategic planning frameworks take into account the Constitution of January 18, 1996, which gives local authorities responsibility for promoting democracy and development at local level. The modernization of public finances is mainly governed by the Law on the Financial Regime of the State and other Entities and by the 2018 Code of Transparency and Good Governance. In 2019, the law 2019/024 relating to the General code of Regional and Local Authorities (LA) has been promulgated.

Despite the efforts of the Cameroonian government to promote decentralisation and implementation of public finance reforms, some challenges abound. Councils need more capacity reinforcement to mobilize sufficient resources to ensure the sustainable development of infrastructure and the efficient delivery of services. Actually, transfers do not fully cover the financing needs of municipalities. As a result, public services are not provided to the population in the required quantity and quality. Transparency in public action is limited by insufficient sanctions and weak institutionalization. The needs and potential of local populations, particularly women, girls and other vulnerable and marginalised groups (including young people), are not sufficiently considered in the formulation and development of policies at local level.

The Support Programme for Strengthening Decentralisation and Financial Governance (PADGOF) focuses on the improvements in gender equality, financial distribution keys, councils' own revenues, good climate-sensitive local governance and citizen participation. It contributes to the progress of decentralisation to ensure an efficient and transparent provision of services by local authorities. Its main political partners are the Ministry of Decentralisation and Local Development (MINDDEVEL) and the Ministry of Finance (MINFI). The programme is declined into four areas of intervention.

Programmes

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Services

In cooperation with MINDDEVEL and MINFI, PADGOF focuses on strengthening decentralisation process and modernizing public finance management in Cameroon. In this regard, the programme strengthens the capacities of municipalities and Decentralized State Services (SDE) through training and advisory support in the areas of good local governance, public finance management, citizen participation and delivery of services, to improve local development.

PADGOF, in collaboration with government institutions, SDE and other technical and financial partners, implements activities aimed at :

- Improving the satisfaction of the population within their municipalities, through citizen oriented services to promote transparency and accountability in local governance;
- Implementing inclusive and participatory approaches by partner municipalities in order to strengthen the participation of local populations, Community-Based Organisations (CBOs), civil society and local economic stakeholders,
- Networking, leadership development, coaching and training on local governance for local professionals and managers, particularly women leaders at local level,
- Improving citizens' rights, particularly those of women and girls, and empowering them to reduce poverty and inequality,
- Advisory support on the reform of financial decentralisation and the different roles and responsibilities in consultation with key stakeholders,
- Scaling up gender- and climate-sensitive budgets with sectoral ministries.
- Increasing local revenue, for example through improved digital solutions and better management of taxes and expenditure.

Approach

PADGOF draws on the experience and achievements of the Support Programme for Municipal Development (PROMUD) and the Support Programme for Modernizing Public Finances (PAMFIP), and integrates them in its implementation approach. In addition, the Programme calls on national and international experts to provide direct advisory support services to partners. It also draws on the expertise of service providers and civil society organisations (CSOs). PADGOF uses a systemic approach that strengthens networking and facilitates coordination between stakeholders at different levels and in different sectors. The multi-level approach also enables results to be reported and used, from the municipal level to the regional and national levels, and vice versa.



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
