#### **About the Programme**

The Good Governance for Local Development Programme South Caucasus (hereinafter "The Programme" or "GGLD") advises and supports respective partner organizations at national, regional (sub-national) and local levels in Armenia, Georgia and Azerbaijan in the implementation of cooperation initiatives towards improved local governance. It supports the improvement of frame conditions, addresses regional (sub-national) governance issues and works towards the improvement of capacities of key actors in providing citizen-oriented municipal services.

To increase transparency and accountability of local governance, the Programme advises

on the introduction of citizen participation and complaint mechanisms and support awareness raising for citizens. also supports the elaboration and application of tools and strategies for regional and local economic development.


In the context of the German international cooperation approach, the Programme's objectives are oriented within the framework of the Caucasus Initiative; thus, the improved professional exchange among the countries of the South Caucasus and their increasing cooperation are also objectives at regional South Caucasus level.

The Good Governance for Local Development Programme South Caucasus is the successor of the Good Local Governance in the South Caucasus Programme implemented on behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and in Armenia co-financed by Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC).

The Programme is carried out in close cooperation with the Ministry of Territorial Administration and Infrastructure (MTAI) as the main political partner.


#### **Objective**

The objective of the grant scheme is the alleviation of the Covid-19 consequences in Armenian communities through grant initiatives for local economic development (LED).











#### Institutional setup

Established in 2021, the grant fund (Fund) allows for implementation of LED projects in consolidated multi-settlement municipalities of Armenia based on their priorities and assessed needs. With the aim to promote public-private partnerships and contribute to increasing the investment attractiveness of communities, the grant scheme offers a possibility to involve various actors in project proposal design, including the municipality (also joint proposals by more than one municipality), community-based organisations, start-ups, microbusinesses and entrepreneurs. The final project proposal should be approved by the local council (Avagani) and submitted to the Fund. The major criterion of the grant scheme is the socio-economic benefit for the community (e.g. job creation, increase of arable lands,

improvement of tourist attractiveness and business atmosphere, increase of budgetary flows of the municipality) without sector limitation. All projects must be reflected in the LED plans and Annual Work Plans (AWP) of the submitting municipalities and entail at least 20% co-financing by municipalities, stipulated in their annual budgets. The maximum grant value shall amount up to  $\in$  20.000 or, in case of inter-community initiatives, up to  $\in$  50.000. The administration of the grant scheme (advising on project proposals design, appraisal, monitoring and evaluation) is conducted jointly with the Core Group of LED officers (LED CG) from various municipalities (14 members as of May 2022).

# Establishment of a solar photovoltaic power station for the kindergarten of Basen settlement (Akhuryan municipality)

The acquisition of a solar photovoltaic power station for the kindergarten of Basen village is a major achievement for Akhuryan municipality. Due to harsh and long winters in Basen, the kindergarten is non-operational during winter months. The installation of the solar station will allow for adequate heating of the kindergarten building and ensure uninterrupted pre-school education for the children of Based, Hovit and Jrarat villages. Besides, the solar station will reduce CO2 emissions by 87 tons in the course of 30 years and save ca. 2000 EUR in the municipal budget annually, which can then be directed to the implementation of other development initiatives.





## Third phase of the establishment of community market in Noyemberyan

The north of Tavush province is famous for its fertile soil and mild climate, conducive to agricultural activities. However, due to the lack of an agricultural market, the farmers do not have a possibility to sell their produce directly to consumers. After the completion of the third construction phase through the grant fund, the market is only lacking internal furnishing to be fully operational. With 15 closed pavilions, 50 outdoor retail points and 5 truck sales points, the rentals will generate an own revenue of ca. 20 million AMD for the municipality.
