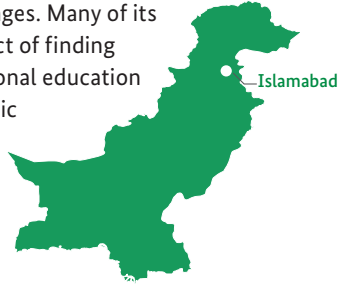

German Cooperation with Pakistan

Pakistan is facing numerous challenges. Many of its 210 million citizens have no prospect of finding work. Serious deficiencies in vocational education and training are hampering economic development. The country's political institutions are weak and participation in political processes is low. In addition, the power supply is erratic and inefficient.

Working on behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH's activities focus on the priority areas sustainable economic development, good governance, and energy.

GIZ provides support for thousands of apprentices and vocational education institutions, for the country's social security and health insurance system, and for the Pakistani Government in ensuring social and environmental standards are upheld.

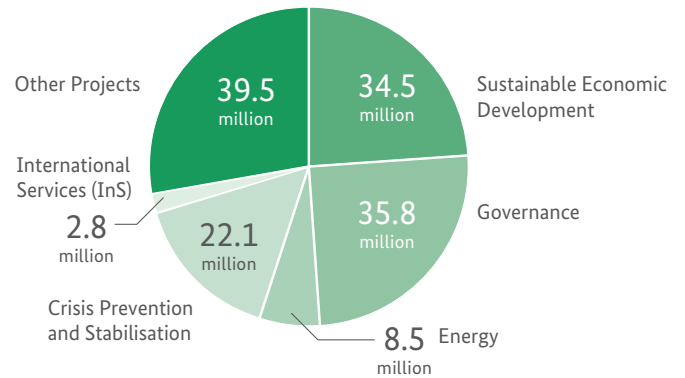
It is advising Pakistan on a more efficient, transparent and citizen-friendly approach to governance including assistance for the development on the border with Afghanistan.

GIZ is also supporting the use of renewable energies and energy efficiency through financing options and technical implementation.

On behalf of the German Federal Foreign Office (AA), GIZ is helping Pakistan to improve its management of refugees and its police force and judiciary.

In addition to its two main commissioning parties, BMZ and AA, GIZ is also carrying out projects based on co-financing arrangements with other donors such as the EU, UK and Norway.

Sustainable Economic Development

Governance



In the FATA-Region **50** Community Based Organisations (CBO) were established



About **94,700** people participated in municipal, regional or national political consensus-building or decision-making processes



More than **1,836** CBO members were trained in community management, communications, leadership, monitoring and auditing



About **469** police officers and prosecutors were trained in investigations, forensics and pedagogy skills



More than **58,800** Afghan refugees benefitted from GIZ measures in Pakistan



2 criminal investigations schools were established

Energy



Over **414** MW of renewable energy were generated



About **123,800** MWhel of electrical energy were generated



More than **16,800** people gained access to modern energy supply



Over **123,000** MWhth of thermal power were saved

Other Sectors



More than **15 million** students, including almost **7 million** girls, received a better school education



More than **4,500** women were attended in childbirth by trained medical personnel
