Mapping training and work opportunities: geo-based services

The new geo location feature makes it easy to locate companies in a trainee's immediate proximity. Using their verified address, companies and TVET institutes are visualized on a map.



Which skills are in demand? Online survey and projections

To date, our analysis of future trends and skills requirements in the construction sector has been based on personal surveys of company representatives. Now NSIS offers an online survey tool where companies can complete a set of predefined questions. This online survey is more efficient, more cost-effective and less subject to (human) error.



The 'like' button: rating of companies offering training

In the interests of transparency and quality improvement, NSIS now offers a rating function. Trainees can rate a company based on their training and working experience. As is the case with established rating portals, all NSIS users are able to see the ratings.



Visualisation of vocational education and training data

The new NSIS feature uses visual graphs and maps to present data on vocational education and training in the construction sector. Our aim is to encourage use of the data by presenting it in a simplified, accessible and visual form.

Gender bias? Better and safer access for girls and women

What applies to men may not apply to women in the same way and vice versa. Following an assessment of usertraffic on NSIS, we have addressed and rectified the potential unintended gender bias of some features:



Reporting misuse of personal data

Your personal data is safe with us: with the new function on NSIS you can report the misuse of your personal data to representatives of the platform.



Better privacy settings for students and jobseekers

Protecting privacy is an important aspect of NSIS. Personal data and full profile details are only visible if students and jobseekers give their consent. Only general information such as qualifications, district and previous experience is visible to employers by default.



Customised information for girls and women

A section on the page provides information on career opportunities and vocational guidance services specifically for girls and women. This feature hosts news on career events and interesting employers and institutions for female users.



Uncomfortable about sharing your display picture? Use an avatar

We want to create equal opportunities. For that reason, jobseekers registering on NSIS can use an avatar instead of uploading a picture of themselves.
