## **Cooperation arrangements**

The project within the German Government and Federal States Programme (German: Bund-Länder-Programm; BLP) is being implemented in cooperation with the bilateral technical cooperation (TC) project on Promoting Needsbased Technical and Vocational Education and Training. The project is supported by Bavarian actors experienced in developing innovative and organisational solar solutions for agriculture, including the Weihenstephan-Triesdorf University of Applied Sciences (HWST), Deutsche Genossenschaftsverband e.V (German Cooperative Union) and Women Engage for a Common Future (WECF) e.V. It is carried out in cooperation with the Nigerian Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, the Delegation of German Industry and Commerce in Nigeria (AHK Nigeria) and the Small and Medium Enterprise Development Agency (SMEDAN).

## What we are doing - and how

The project helps selected experts and managers from Nigeria to gain the knowledge required to plan and implement solar solutions in the agricultural sector.

The full package of measures is structured into four core components that employees from particularly relevant and interested institutions and companies from the partner country can participate in:

A two-week digital study trip provides participants with the opportunity to get to know and understand technological solutions and to communicate directly with Bavaria-based actors.

- A second virtual workshop is centred around innovative business models, financing options and the formation of (women's) cooperatives. This project is targeted at decision-makers in the Nigerian private, public and civil society sectors.
- In the management training programme, experts and managers from Nigeria introduce existing business models and enable more in-depth exploration of existing knowledge. This training is augmented by virtual visits to Bavarian technology providers.
- The business-to-business matchmaking session at the end of the programme allows participants to directly initiate cooperation projects; Nigerian and Bavarian companies present their solutions and challenges, and have the opportunity to make direct contact with one another.
