Qualified Teachers for Vocational Education and Training in India

Local situation

According to the United Nations, India will have the largest population of any country in the world by 2024. Every year some 15 million young Indians pour onto the labour market, which at present offers training opportunities for only around 3.2 million young people. One reason for this is the shortage of qualified teachers and trainers with the expertise required to deliver high-quality courses.

In 2015, as part of its Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) to action on climate, India set itself the target of reducing the emissions intensity of its economy by 33 to 35 per cent by 2030 compared with the 2005 level. The "green employment sector" therefore has the potential to create future-proof jobs.

Practical technical training

Cooperation arrangements

The Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) set up the Indo-German Programme for Vocational Education and Training to help its Indian partners develop and improve cooperative in-company vocational training. As part of the German Government and Federal States Programme (German: Bund-Länder-Programm; BLP), the project will complement these activities by focusing on the training of specialists in vocational education. The project's technical partner is the state-funded Hessian Institute for Advanced Training in Technology (HLFT), which specialises in renewable energy and has gained a wealth of experience in the field of energy and resource efficiency.

What we are doing - and how

Indian vocational schoolteachers and trainers are obtaining qualifications in energy-efficient building automation. This is an opportunity for participants to improve their theoretical knowledge while acquiring all-important practical experience and learning about Germany's dual vocational education and training system. The training is carried out in two phases. The first phase takes place in India using a blended learning format, and the second phase is a four-week course at the HLFT. The combination of practical teaching and appropriate didactic methods allows participants to acquire both technical and pedagogical skills.

An additional school-management training module offers participants in administrative and decision-making personnel the chance to attend a two-week course in Germany. This course covers the practical side of Germany's dual vocational training system and cooperation between vocational schools and companies as places of learning. As well as these specialist matters, the course explores the topics of women in leadership and women in technical occupations.
