Project concept

The Climate and Biodiversity Hub Indonesia project aims to strengthen the mainstreaming and implementation of Indonesia's climate and biodiversity policy. Partners are the Ministry of National Development Planning (BAPPENAS), the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (KLHK), other related line ministries as well as state and non-state stakeholders at national and subnational levels.

Policy advice, capacity building and interministerial exchange support the advancement of a holistic approach towards climate and biodiversity policy planning and implementation, as well as mainstreaming with national development planning. This is accompanied by mobilizing additional resources, also considering ways to strengthen the engagement of a wider range of financial and private institutions. Synergies between climate change action and biodiversity conservation are strengthened. In its function as IKI interface in Indonesia, the project facilitates political dialogue, networking and communication between all project implementers under the IKI and the Indonesian government.

The project is implemented by the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH in two components. The Climate Impact Response and Biodiversity Management Planning in Indonesia (ClimB) component focuses on support for BAPPENAS and includes the interface function called IKI Hub, whereas the Climate and Biodiversity (CLARITY) component collaborates closely with KLHK.

Background

Climate change impacts and biodiversity loss are two of the most important challenges of the 21st century. To tackle these challenges the international community adopted the Paris Agreement and the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD). The Government of Indonesia is committed to contribute to the achievement of both multilateral agreements. Over the last years, Indonesia already developed a solid climate and biodiversity policy framework. However, challenges to further develop the implementation strategies remain.

Since its establishment in 2008, the International Climate Initiative (IKI) of the German government partners with the Government of Indonesia to achieve the climate and biodiversity goals. Indonesia is one of the 13 IKI priority countries, with currently over 50 projects in various sectors.

Objective

The overall objective of the project is a strengthened policy framework in Indonesia, that creates the enabling conditions for a more effective and cohesive implementation of climate change mitigation, adaptation and biodiversity conservation measures in Indonesia. In addition, the policy dialogue between the Indonesian and German governments supports a comprehensive Indonesian transformation process.

This will be achieved by the following outputs.

1. Integration of climate policy and green recovery measures into Indonesia's National Development Plans

3. Improved implementation of key biodiversity policy processes

2. Increased capacity to represent Indonesia's priorities at the international climate change negotiations and strengthened contribution to the achievement of Indonesia's NDC targets

4. Strengthened policy dialogue on climate change and biodiversity in general and on IKI activities in particular between the Government of Indonesia and BMUV as well as between IKI implementers

The outputs comprise the following activities:

Climate Impact Response and Biodiversity Management Planning in Indonesia (ClimB), including IKI Hub

- Support the review of the RPJMN 2020-2024 to track the progress of climate and biodiversity implementation
- Contribute to the development of a green RPJMN 2025-2029 and RPJPN 2025-2045
- Identify pilot projects as well as public and private finance mechanisms to support the implementation of Low Carbon Development Indonesia (LCDI)
- Enhance the Monitoring and Evaluation Framework for LCDI and biodiversity performance within the RPJMN
- Contribute to the Post 2020-Biodiversity Framework development
- Support the development of biodiversity financing mechanisms
- Networking for identification of synergies
- Achieve a common understanding of the issues to be amplified and put in practice
- Hold bilateral high-level exchange to foster intergovernmental initiatives in the fields of climate mitigation, adaptation and biodiversity conservation

Climate and Biodiversity (CLARITY)

- Enhance Indonesia's National Focal Point inputs to the upcoming climate change negotiations
- Support the communication of negotiation results to relevant stakeholders and the Indonesian public
- Strengthen the participatory development process for the development of the Updated NDC
- Support the design and implementation of a carbon pricing instrument
- Strengthen capacity building for local mitigation and adaptation measures
- Support the development of an implementation strategy for the conservation of high biodiversity areas
- Improve the institutional capacity for internal and external knowledge management of the Clearing House Mechanism (CHM)
- Contribute to the development of a national strategy on biodiversity prospecting that is based on Access and Benefit Sharing enshrined in the Nagoya Protocol
