What are Long-Term Strategies (LTS)?

Legal framework:

- Paris Agreement. Art. 4. sub. 19
- Glasgow Climate Pact. CMA.3, IV

Diversity of terms based on Common But Differentiated Responsibilities (CBDR) principle and of target year by or around mid-century:

- Net zero; carbon neutrality; low carbon; low GHG emission; etc.
- 2035; 2045; 2050; 2060; 2070

Long-term commitments set in:

- Law (e.g., Climate Bill)
- In policy document (e.g., LTS, NDC)
- Head of state commitment (e.g., at COPs)
- Aspirations/visions


Overview of GLZ projects providing LTS support

- In total, **37 countries** are covered with LTS related projects.
- There are **14 projects** related to LTS (bilateral, multilateral (regional and global)).
- **Funding** source: IKI (AA & BMWK), BMZ
- **Type** of support:
 - direct and indirect support to LTS
 - both for adaptation and mitigation
