The Project “One Health and Agroecology” has been agreed upon between the Governments of India and of Germany and is being implemented by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), New Delhi, in collaboration with various state ministries and supported by Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ).

ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP:

The internship will be based in Bhopal and will involve support of the State Nodal Officer and District Nodal Officer, under the guidance of the project’s state-level coordinator, for the implementation of the One Health and Agroecology project in 40 villages across Banda and Rehli blocks of Sagar district. The intern will support the project team in executing activities according to the operational plan at both field and state levels, providing technical and implementation assistance. The role will also include documentation of field-level processes, coordination support, and contribution to the overall monitoring of project interventions.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

The Intern will work under the GIZ team, especially under guidance of the project’s state-level coordinator, and support the team in the planning and execution of activities according to the operational plan in coordination with the state and district-level implementing partners.

S/he will be responsible for the following tasks:

- Support the project’s state-level coordinator in coordinating with the state nodal departments to plan and implement activities under the operational plan.
- Support the development of an interdepartmental action plan to promote the judicious use of anthelmintics such as Albendazole.
- Support organising, facilitating and monitoring of workshops, trainings, meetings, field visits and review sessions at the state level.
- Assist in preparation and review of documents such as training material, study reports, documentation of field-level interventions, workshop reports, training reports, and key learnings.

- Assist in media and communication contributions related to the project.
- Assist the project team in translating documents from English to Hindi and Hindi to English.
- Assist the GIZ project team with further tasks as needed.

The performance of the selected candidate will be reviewed by the project's state-level coordinator in coordination with the GIZ team at regular intervals based on the responsibilities assigned.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Master's degree in Veterinary Science or equivalent field. Candidatures can be accepted until up to six months after completing the qualifying degree.
2. The candidate must have prior permission (NOC) from their institution for a 6-month internship, if currently enrolled.
3. Understanding of livestock and animal health issues in Madhya Pradesh, including good practices in the use of animal drugs, is essential. Familiarity with the One Health approach is considered an advantage.
4. Proven experience in organizing workshops, trainings, meetings and public events is preferred.
5. Practical experience in designing and executing structured interviews with local communities is an advantage.
6. Proven ability to engage effectively and in an adequate form both with local communities and with stakeholders at decision maker level is expected.
7. Independent, proactive working style is required.
8. Fluency in Hindi and English (incl. reading, report writing, and proofreading) are a must. Knowledge of local dialects is an advantage.
9. Strong working knowledge of Microsoft Excel, Word, and PowerPoint is expected.
10. Willingness to travel from Bhopal to the project area (Sagar District) for up to 5 days at a time is expected, when required for project implementation.
