ABOUT US:

ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP:

The project is engaging an Intern who will be based in Saligao, Goa or Panjim, Goa, (depending on their technical focus) to support the creation and documentation of knowledge regarding Kyasanur Forest Disease (KFD), including measures to manage the disease and prevent its spread, and other One Health related topics. For this, the Intern will support activities conducted by Goa State Biodiversity Department, Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services, and other involved stakeholders.

In addition, s/he will support the project team in drafting and translating documents and in organising meetings, workshops and other events.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

- The Intern will work under the overall supervision and guidance of the Project’s State Coordinator. To fulfil his/her tasks s/he will coordinate with specific team members from the project and the state nodal officer of the project in Goa (Goa State Biodiversity Board).
- S/he will support in **compiling information regarding KFD, including Tick Surveillance, and other One Health related topics (e.g., zoonotic and vector-borne diseases, food safety)**, with focus on Goa.

- S/he will **support in conducting field work** in coordination with Goa State Biodiversity Board and other involved State departments.
- S/he will assist the Project's State Coordinator and State Nodal Officer in **organising meetings, training, and workshops** (online and in person) with the BMC and Village Panchayat members, workshops with the State departments in Goa, project meetings on the ground, etc.
- S/he will **support the documentation of the project activities and events** (which will be held in English and/or Konkani), including workshop proceedings, monthly panchayat meetings, and training reports.
- S/he will **translate IEC** (Information, Education, and Communication) **materials and other documents between English and Konkani**.
- S/he will assist the project team in the general day-to-day activities and carry out any other work assigned to her/him, as and when required.

The performance of the selected candidate will be reviewed by the State Coordinator and Project Manager in coordination with the State Nodal Officer at regular intervals based on the responsibilities assigned.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Qualifying Degree in Life Sciences, Zoology, Veterinary Sciences, Public Health or related fields. Candidatures can be accepted until up to six months after completing the qualifying degree.
2. Prior permission (NOC) from institution for a 6-month internship, if currently enrolled.
3. Good knowledge regarding One Health related topics is essential. Specific knowledge regarding the impact of these topics in Goa would be an asset.
4. Experience in field work and/or laboratory work with regard to One Health related topics would be an asset.
5. Experience in organizing meetings, workshops and other events would be an asset.
6. Experience in writing reports and other documents, as well as drafting posters, is essential. Experience in scientific writing would be an asset.
7. Ability to connect with people and work in a team is expected.
8. Independent, proactive working style is expected.
9. Strong communication skills in English and Konkani (incl. reading, report writing, and proofreading) are a must.
10. Strong working knowledge of Microsoft Excel, Word, and PowerPoint is expected.
11. The candidate is expected to be able to move independently (self-mobilized) to reach locations within the project area in Goa.
